Friendly Reminders...

- **AIR CONDITIONING UNITS;** as colder weather conditions are starting to approach, we would like to remind all tenants their air conditioning units should have been removed as of October 15th. If you have not done so, or require assistance with removing it, please fill out a work order and maintenance will be happy to help.
- **BALCONIES:** if you have a breathable rug on your balcony, it should have been removed by October 15th. No other carpeting, decking or any mat is allowed as it can damage the concrete. If you have seasonal furniture on your balcony, you may want to consider storing it indoors during the winter months to help protect it.

Laundry Room... Starting November 1, 2022 the laundry room will be open daily from 6:00am to 11:00pm. Unfortunately, the restroom within the laundry room will still remain closed until maintenance has an opportunity to repair the damage.

Request for Maintenance... As a reminder, all “non-emergency” maintenance requests **MUST BE** submitted to the office **IN WRITING** on one of the “Request for Maintenance” forms. Requests in writing that are submitted will be addressed in a timely manner based upon the nature of the repair required. Repairs will be addressed in priority and can take a few days up to a week to be completed. Plumbing, electrical and heating issues will take precedence over all other requests, and should be reported immediately to the main office at 705-876-1717 ext 201 or after hours ext 5.

Afterhours Emergencies...

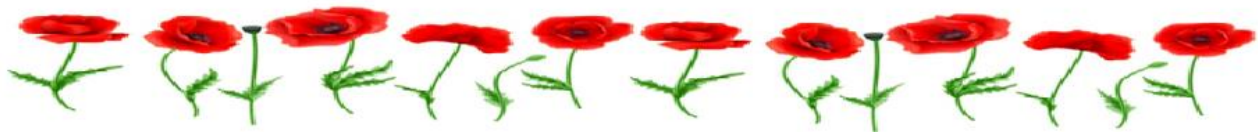
Should you have an emergency outside of our regular business hours, please call 705-876-1717 and press '5'.

Quick Facts on... Remembrance Day

1. Remembrance Day was first observed in 1919 throughout the British Commonwealth. It was originally called "Armistice Day" to commemorate armistice agreement that ended the First World War on Monday, November 11, 1918, at 11 a.m. – on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month.
2. From 1921 to 1930, Armistice Day was held on the Monday of the week in which November 11 fell. In 1931, Alan Neill, Member of Parliament for Comox–Alberni, introduced a bill to observe Armistice Day only on November 11. Passed by the House of Commons, the bill also changed the name to "Remembrance Day". The first Remembrance Day was observed on November 11, 1931.
3. Every year on November 11, Canadians pause in a moment of silence to honor and remember the men and women who have served, and continue to serve Canada during times of war, conflict and peace. We remember the more than 2,300,000 Canadians who have served throughout our nation's history and the more than 118,000 who made the ultimate sacrifice.
4. The poppy is the symbol of Remembrance Day. Replica poppies are sold by the Royal Canadian Legion to provide assistance to Veterans.
5. The national ceremony is held at the National War Memorial in Ottawa. The Governor General of Canada presides over the ceremony. It is also attended by the Prime Minister, other government officials, representatives of Veterans' organizations, diplomatic representatives, other dignitaries, Veterans as well as the general public.
