Building Heating System... We would like to take this opportunity to share some information with you regarding the heating system at Valley High II. Heat is distributed to your rental unit by way of a hot water boiler system. Hot water radiators are made from metal because it's an excellent conductor of heat. Hot water travels through the radiator and the exterior fins naturally heat up. As the air around the radiator heats up, it rises up and out of the way; new cooler air comes in to take its place. A rotational current of air forms around the radiator causing all the air in the room to slowly heat up. The hot water radiators are located directly underneath the living room and bedroom windows. Extremely cold air coming in through open windows condenses on the metal radiator pipes and poses a serious threat of frozen water pipes, which causes pipes to burst, triggering a flood.

Thankfully, so far this year, winter weather conditions have been quite mild. However, frozen water pipes are a serious threat during the winter months. Avoid opening windows under exceptionally cold conditions and <u>never</u> turn the heat off completely in your unit. To help prevent freezing and/or bursting pipes, throughout the winter months it is recommended tenants turn up the thermostat within their rental unit once daily to allow flow of hot water. To resolve a persistent issue with too much or too little heat, fill out and submit a request for maintenance form immediately. This form allows Myer Cherney Holdings Ltd. staff permission to access your unit to effect repair.

### Fire Safety Begins with You....

Are you prepared if there were a fire at Valley High II? Would you know what to do in the event of fire? With the influx of high-rise apartment building fires, here are a few good reminders:

- Fire drills are typically scheduled annually in the fall. We encourage, and it is highly recommended all tenants participate; though it is not mandatory. By participating, it will help prepare you if the need to evacuate should ever arise.
- Familiarize yourself with the location of all available exit stairways located in both the east and west towers on each floor in the event the nearest one is blocked by fire or smoke.
- > To stay or to go: Most of the time, the best thing to do in a fire is leave the building as soon as possible. But in some cases, you may not be able to leave and you may have to stay in your rental unit. Whether you decide to stay or go, you must act quickly and protect yourself from the smoke.

#### Lock Outs & Lost Keys....

Due to unfortunate circumstances, tenants may get locked out of their apartments or even lose their keys. We are fortunate to have after hour emergency on-call services; however, lock outs, and lost keys are not considered an emergency. For any lockouts, tenants will be invoiced and responsible to pay for the service call.

#### Request for Maintenance...

These forms are always available and located just outside the Valley High 2 office door. Your Name, unit #, date and a description of the work required must be filled in. Maintenance staff <u>WILL NOT</u> attend any rental units upon verbal requests, unless it is an emergency situation.

#### **Tenant Reminders**

- Lost and/or stolen building keys are subject to an administration and replacement fee.
- A minimum of 24 hours advance notice is required to book the service elevator.
- All pets must be leashed at all times when in the common areas of Valley High II and/or on the grounds. Please don't forget to stoop & scoop.
- > Do not throw items off your balcony.
- A request for maintenance form must be fully completed, dated and signed. The yellow and white copies of the request form are to be placed in the VHII office mailbox, and will be addressed in a timely manner and in order of urgency.
- Tenants must park in their own assigned parking spaces. Failure to do so, will lead to a notice being left on the vehicle. For repeat offenders, the vehicle is subject to being ticketed and/or towed away at the vehicle owner's expense.

#### **Baked Caramelized Onion Triple Cheese Dip**

#### **Ingredients:**

2 tablespoons unsalted butter 1 yellow onion, finely chopped 4 cloves garlic, roughly chopped 2 cups shredded Cheddar

1 cup shredded Gouda2 tablespoons whole milk1 cup shredded Havarti cheese2 thopped fresh chives, for garnish

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Preheat the oven to 425 degrees F.
- 2. Heat the butter in a small cast-iron skillet over medium-high heat, Add the onion and cook, stirring occasionally, until softened and starting to brown, about 8 minutes. Add the garlic and cook, stirring for 30 seconds. Top the onion mixture with the cheeses. Add the milk and stir everything to combine.
- 3. Place the skillet inside a roasting pan or baking dish and fill the pan with enough hot water to come halfway up the sides of the skillet. Transfer to the oven and bake until the cheese is melted and gooey, 20 to 25 minutes. Sprinkle with chives and serve immediately with crackers or bread.

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
